The Apostle Paul and Social Distancing during his imprisonment

- Put yourself in the Apostle Paul's shoes as he writes from a Roman prison, socially distant from everyone except the soldier he is chained to.
- How did Paul deal with Social Distancing?
- Creativity in continuing his work
 - Paul wrote 14 of the 27 books of the New Testament
 - He wrote Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, and Philemon while socially distancing...in prison.

• New relationships (e.g. Praetorian Guard)

Philippians 1:12-14 ¹² I want you to know, brothers, that what has happened to me has really served to advance the gospel, ¹³ so that it has become known throughout the whole imperial (praetorian) guard and to all the rest that my imprisonment is for Christ. ¹⁴ And most of the brothers, having become confident in the Lord by my imprisonment, are much more bold to speak the word without fear.

Philippians 4:4-7 ⁴ Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. ⁵ Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; ⁶ do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

• How did Paul deal with anxiety during social distancing? Hope in the Resurrection of Jesus AND his future Resurrection!

Philippians 1:18b-21 ^{18b} Yes, and I will rejoice, ¹⁹ for I know that through your prayers and the help of the Spirit of Jesus Christ this will turn out for my deliverance, ²⁰ as it is my eager expectation and hope that I will not be at all ashamed, but that with full courage now as always Christ will be honored in my body, whether by life or by death. ²¹ For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain.

Philippians 1:22-26 ²² If I am to live in the flesh, that means fruitful labor for me. Yet which I shall choose I cannot tell. ²³ I am hard pressed between the two. My desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better. ²⁴ But to remain in the flesh is more necessary on your account. ²⁵ Convinced of this, I know that I will remain and continue with you all, for your progress and joy in the faith, ²⁶ so that in me you may have ample cause to glory in Christ Jesus, because of my coming to you again.

- The only reason that Paul had this kind of hope is because Jesus rose from the dead that first Easter morning!
- Does anyone remember the story of the Gladiator Spartacus?

The War of Spartacus in 73 BC

- From Wiki: The War of Spartacus was the last in a series of slave rebellions against the Roman Republic. The War of Spartacus was the only one directly to threaten the Roman heartland of Italia. It was particularly alarming to Rome because its military seemed powerless to suppress it.
- The revolt began in 73 BC, with the escape of around 70 slave-gladiators from a gladiator school in Capua; they easily defeated the small Roman force sent to recapture them. Within two years, they had been joined by some 120,000 men, women and children; the able-bodied adults of this band were a surprisingly effective armed force that repeatedly showed they could withstand or defeat the Roman military.
- The Roman Senate grew increasingly alarmed at the slave-army's continued military successes. Eventually Rome fielded an army of eight legions under the harsh but effective leadership of Marcus Licinius Crassus. The war ended in 71 BC when, after a long and bitter fighting retreat before the legions of Crassus and the realization that the legions of Gnaeus Pompeius Magnus and Marcus Terentius Varro Lucullus were moving in to entrap them, the armies of Spartacus launched their full strength against Crassus' legions and were utterly defeated. Of the survivors, some 6,000 were crucified along the Appian Way.

VIRTUAL BACKGROUND—CRUCIFIXION ON THE APPIAN WAY

- While most of the rebel slaves were killed on the battlefield, these 6,000 survivors were captured by the legions of Crassus. All 6,000 were crucified along the Appian Way from Rome to Capua.
- And yet no one remembers a single person's name who died by crucifixion before 33 AD. But we know the Name of a Man who was shamefully put to death by crucifixion. You know who that person is?
- Without the real, historical, physical Resurrection of Jesus Christ, the carpenter out of backwoods Nazareth, we wouldn't even know His Name today! I believe that's true. He would just be a nameless victim of Roman crucifixion along with thousands of others who died the most shameful death invented by humanity.

John 12:24 Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit.

- Sin is the global pandemic that has caused social distancing between us and our Creator and also between us and one another. Sin is why there's so much relational strife in the world.
- The Gospel is that Jesus lived the perfect life that we should and never could live, and that He died and was buried in the ground like a Seed, and emerged from the ground totally transformed to pave the way for your and my total transformation! And one day social distancing between us and God and us and one another will totally be gone.
- Let's sing together about this Gospel.

New Normal: Physical Resurrection & No More Social Distancing

• As the loss of life goes up and the economic wealth of the world goes down yet the canals of Venice flow clear and pollution in China dissipates, all of creation is groaning with eager longing for Resurrection!

Romans 8:22-25 ²² For we know that the whole creation has been groaning together in the pains of childbirth until now. ²³ And not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies. ²⁴ For in this hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what he sees? ²⁵ But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

• The NEW NORMAL will be when everything is awesome!

Luke 13:18-19 ¹⁸ He said therefore, "What is the kingdom of God like? And to what shall I compare it? ¹⁹ It is like a grain of mustard seed that a man took and sowed in his garden, and it grew and became a tree, and the birds of the air made nests in its branches."

- Upside Down Kingdom of God
- The smallest of seeds

VIRTUAL BACKGROUND—NEW GROWTH

- There are principles here about the Kingdom of God.
- Things start small. Micromovements are profound. I'm always looking for new growth in my houseplants and in my neighborhood.
- The end game is to bless others. Love others. Serve others. Bear fruit for others. Provide safety and shelter for others. Sacrificial, self-giving love is the goal of the Kingdom of God...and that's most clearly demonstrated in the death of Christ.
- Social distancing will go away totally when Jesus returns because of the Resurrection. But Resurrection requires death!

1 Corinthians 15:42-44 ⁴² So is it with the resurrection of the dead. What is sown is perishable; what is raised is imperishable. ⁴³ It is sown in dishonor; it is raised in glory. It is sown in weakness; it is raised in power. ⁴⁴ It is sown a natural body; it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual body.

2 Corinthians 4:16-18 ¹⁶ So we do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day. ¹⁷ For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, ¹⁸ as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal.

VIRTUAL BACKGROUND—PINK SUPERMOON

- I drove out near Pillsbury Crossing last Tuesday night to look at the Pink Supermoon with my seven year old son, Maddox. I long to be among the stars!
- You might say, "I just can't believe in the Resurrection." Well, I'd challenge you to consider more deeply the claims of the Bible. I remember in January when Maris shared with me about people she knew in China who were being quarantined because of COVID-19 and I thought, "I'm so thankful that we are the furthest spot on earth from Wuhan as possible. This will never get to us." I can't believe that we're living in such a surreal time that feels like a sci-fi movie...yet here it is. The evidence is all around me and you. And I believe it.
- I'd challenge you to also consider the evidence for the historic person of Jesus Christ, His real death on a Roman cross, and His historically substantiated physical Resurrection from the tomb on Easter morning!

1 Corinthians 9:25-27 ²⁵ Every athlete exercises self-control in all things. They do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable. ²⁶ So I do not run aimlessly; I do not box as one beating the air. ²⁷ But I discipline my body and keep it under control, lest after preaching to others I myself should be disqualified.

What's your next intentional step this Easter during the COVID-19 era?

- Respond to the Gospel for the first time. How amazing would it be to look back on this time and be able to say, "Remember COVID-19? That's when I began a relationship with Jesus!"
- Run more intentionally in your faith.
