10:30—Walk in Wisdom

Alright, COVID-19! You got me. You finally rattled me. I DON'T. KNOW. WHAT. TO. DO. What am I gonna do with my kids this fall? What am I gonna do with my kids this afternoon? What am I gonna do now that the financial strain is beginning to set in? What am I gonna do with our church plant? When and where do we meet? Are we even gonna make it through this thing? Or will Tallgrass Church be one of your casualties? COVID, are you here? Right now? Are you listening? Wait a minute. Why am I talking to a virus? Have a finally lost my mind completely? I knew this was coming!

Hold up. The person I really want to talk to is God. Please turn into your Bibles, church family, as I read from Psalm 13. King David sums up my thoughts right now nicely. The Psalms put great words to the emotions of our human experience.

Psalm 13:1-4

How long, O LORD? Will you forget me forever?
How long will you hide your face from me?

How long must I take counsel in my soul
and have sorrow in my heart all the day?

How long shall my enemy be exalted over me?

Consider and answer me, O LORD my God;
light up my eyes, lest I sleep the sleep of death,

⁴ lest my enemy say, "I have prevailed over him," lest my foes rejoice because I am shaken.

Let's pray.

What are the wise things to do right now? What does wisdom look like? Is the wise thing to go back to meeting online only for church or move forward with meeting in person? Is the wise thing to put on a mask everywhere you go or fight for the right to not put on a mask anywhere you go? Is the wise thing to send kids back to school or keep them in our homes?

What are the inputs into your life that are informing how you think about these things? Where are you turning to for wisdom? What voices are ringing loudest and winning allegiance in your heart? What news outlets do you consume? How is social media impacting your perspective? Is there a trusted friend or family member whose voice really sway your opinion? Is there a conspiracy theory you've heard that you don't want to admit is capturing your mind? What voices are loudest in your life right now?

Listen for Jesus' voice to me and to you, right now, this morning, here and now, at Long's Park, July 12, 2020, 10:25am.

Matthew 7:26-27

²⁶ "And everyone who hears these words of mine and does not do them will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand. ²⁷ And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell, and great was the fall of it."

If you hear Jesus' words and don't do them, you're a fool and you will fall, and great will be your fall. What is it like to build on sand?

As my emotional resiliency has met it's end this past week, I've felt at a complete loss about the path moving forward. What's been stirred up in me personally is another soul shaking season of reflection about who am I and what am I building my life on. You know, a global pandemic, with mass confusion, and global protest about racial injustice will shake a person up a bit...eventually. I feel the winds blowing and beating against the house that is my life...will I stand strong or will I crumble?

How about you? How's the great building project of your life going today in the middle of 2020?

Are you hearing the words of Jesus? And then are you doing the words of Jesus? Consider that first question, are you even hearing the words of Jesus in the midst of all the voices vying for your attention? Let alone doing them. Can you discern what Jesus is thinking and saying about all of this stuff, all the stuff that brings your anxiety and discouragement?

If so, great! That's amazing! But my guess is, that almost everyone who can hear my voice right now needs to receive a rebuke. I would guess that the voice of Jesus isn't winning the day in your life as it should. I've heard some positive reports about those in our church family who are establishing new normals that are rooting them into Christ. But I've also heard and sensed that we are struggling to connect deeply with Christ. And I'm also struggling to be and feel connected with our church body through this challenging time.

This morning I want to gift you with a rebuke from the Scriptures. You're welcome!

Receive Rebuke

Proverbs 1:20-33

²⁰ Wisdom cries aloud in the street, in the markets she raises her voice;

²¹ at the head of the noisy streets she cries out; at the entrance of the city gates she speaks:

²² "How long, O simple ones, will you love being simple?

How long will scoffers delight in their scoffing and fools hate knowledge?

²³ If you turn at my rebuke,

behold, I will pour out my spirit to you;

I will make my words known to you.

²⁴ Because I have called and you refused to listen, have stretched out my hand and no one has heeded,

²⁵ because you have ignored all my counsel and would have none of my reproof,

²⁶I also will laugh at your calamity; I will mock when terror strikes you,

when terror strikes you like a storm and your calamity comes like a whirlwind, when distress and anguish come upon you.

²⁸Then they will call upon me, but I will not answer; they will seek me diligently but will not find me.

A life of wisdom is built over time, not in one cry for help when things get difficult.

²⁹ Because they hated knowledge and did not choose the fear of the LORD,

Proverbs 9:10 and Psalm 111:10 teach us that the fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom. Fear of the Lord
is not that you're scared of God but that you respect Him and honor Him as the Creator of this world, as the
One who actually knows what's going on and can provide what's needed. Healthy fear of the Lord is leaning in
when He speaks and not disrespecting Him.

³⁰ would have none of my counsel and despised all my rebuke,

³¹ therefore they shall eat the fruit of their way, and have their fill of their own devices.

³² For the simple are killed by their turning away, and the complacency of fools destroys them;

- Now, is Lady Wisdom leading the charge with cancel culture here? You get something wrong and you're done. You have a view that God doesn't agree with and He cancels you. Is that what's happening here?
- Rebuke is really an invitation. Rebuke is an invitation into a better life.
- Rebuke from Lady Wisdom here in the Old Testament which we receive as the voice of Jesus Himself is always an invitation into something better. That invitation into something better is received through repentance. Repentance is simply to turn around and go the other direction.
- Receive the rebuke this morning and repent. Turn around.

³³ but whoever listens to me will dwell secure and will be at ease, without dread of disaster."

• **James 1:5** If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask God, who gives generously to all without reproach, and it will be given him.

Repent

Matthew 7:24-25

²⁴ "Everyone then who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock. ²⁵ And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on the rock."

Replace sand with rock and build

Replace sand with rock and then begin to build upon that foundation.

Jesus' words here and the words in Proverbs present two extremes, either the way of wisdom or the way of foolishness, the wise person or the fool. However, only Jesus lived a perfectly wise life. The rest of us are vacillating between these two extremes, in constant need of renovation.

When you hear the rebuke of Jesus you are invited to repent and then to replace the sand with rock and begin to build on the firm foundation.

The first step to building on the rock that is Christ is to respond to the Gospel.

1 Corinthians 1:18-24

¹⁸ For the word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. ¹⁹ For it is written,

"I will destroy the wisdom of the wise,

and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart."

²⁰ Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? ²¹ For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, it pleased God through the folly of what we preach to save those who believe. ²² For Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom, ²³ but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles, ²⁴ but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God.

- Worldly wisdom is self-serving whereas godly wisdom is self-sacrificing.
- How does Jesus' sacrificially loving wise approach to life inform our decision-making?

WWJD

- Would Jesus wear a mask to protect the elderly and infirm around Him?
- Would Jesus fight for His individual rights or work for the good of the whole?
- Would Jesus actively seek out injustice in the world and then go about addressing those?

Wisdom is to carry your cross because Jesus went to the cross and He's the wisest person to walk the planet!

James 3:13-18 ¹³ Who is wise and understanding among you? By his good conduct let him show his works in the meekness of wisdom. ¹⁴ But if you have bitter jealousy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not boast and be false to the truth. ¹⁵ This is not the wisdom that comes down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, demonic. ¹⁶ For where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there will be disorder and every vile practice. ¹⁷ But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, open to reason, full of mercy and good fruits, impartial and sincere. ¹⁸ And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace.

Psalm 111:10 The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom; all those who practice it have a good understanding. His praise endures forever!

1 Chronicles 12:23-38

²³ These are the numbers of the divisions of the armed troops who came to David in Hebron to turn the kingdom of Saul over to him, according to the word of the LORD. ²⁴ The men of Judah bearing shield and spear were 6,800 armed troops. ²⁵ Of the Simeonites, mighty men of valor for war, 7,100. ²⁶ Of the Levites 4,600. ²⁷ The prince Jehoiada, of the house of Aaron, and with him 3,700. ²⁸ Zadok, a young man mighty in valor, and twenty-two commanders from his own fathers' house. ²⁹ Of the Benjaminites, the kinsmen of Saul, 3,000, of whom the majority had to that point kept their allegiance to the house of Saul. ³⁰ Of the Ephraimites 20,800, mighty men of valor, famous men in their fathers' houses. ³¹ Of the half-tribe of Manasseh 18,000, who were expressly named to come and make David king. ³² Of Issachar, men who had understanding of the times, to know what Israel ought to do, 200 chiefs, and all their kinsmen under their command. ³³ Of Zebulun 50,000 seasoned troops, equipped for battle with all the weapons of war, to help David with singleness of purpose. ³⁴ Of Naphtali 1,000 commanders with whom were 37,000 men armed with shield and spear. ³⁵ Of the Danites 28,600 men equipped for battle. ³⁶ Of Asher 40,000 seasoned troops ready for battle. ³⁷ Of the Reubenites and Gadites and the half-tribe of Manasseh from beyond the Jordan, 120,000 men armed with all the weapons of war. ³⁸ All these, men of war, arrayed in battle order, came to Hebron with a whole heart to make David king over all Israel. Likewise, all the rest of Israel were of a single mind to make David king.

We Need Leaders Like the Men of Issachar

David has his mighty men and attracted many skilled men to his camp. Most were great warriors, but David also had the benefit of the men of Issachar: Of Issachar, men who had understanding of the times, to know what Israel ought to do, 200 chiefs, and all their kinsmen under their command. (1 Chronicles 12:32)

These are fabulous attributes for you to emulate:

- They understood the times.
- They knew what the nation should do.
- They were leaders together ("200 chiefs").
- They were with their families.

We need Issacharian leaders today who can work together. There are enormous changes coming our way. These are hard trends which we won't be able to ignore, and they will affect you, your family, your work, and the people/communities/nations you care about.

For example:

• Over the next 10 years computing power will be 100x what it is today. Another 2 to 2.5 billion people will be connected via the internet.

- Technological progress will eliminate many of the jobs people hold today (and create new work opportunities). Robotics, "artificial" intelligence, 3D printing, ubiquitous sensors, and biomedicine will dramatically improve.
- Cyberwarfare will become as dangerous as nuclear warfare.
- Urbanization will accelerate. We're adding 21 million people (that's three Chicago-land populations) to
 urban centers annually. Affluence increases and abject poverty decreases. In all but a few developing
 countries the aging population creates new stresses on society. We must produce enough food for 2
 billion more people on the same amount of land, and find energy and water sources for everyone's needs.

Nothing in our recent past prepares us for the magnitude of these changes. Our children may be amused at what life was like in 2015 when we only had smartphones and had to drive cars ourselves.

We can also recognize that some things will not change:

- The Great Commission (Matthew 28:18-20) and the Great Commandment (Matthew 22:37-40).
- Our need for wisdom (even more precious as knowledge floods around us).
- The need for every generation to be taught what is important and how to live well.
- God's steadfast love and presence.
- Christianity is demonstrably the best way to live in relation with God and with one another.

As leaders, we should lean into certain changes and do our part to shape changes to help people and glorify God. Here are mistakes you should avoid:

- Assuming Jesus returns before you have to adapt to uncomfortable changes.
- Assuming the government will take care of you, or even have your best interests at heart.
- Trusting in the educational patterns of the 1900's to be effective for young people in the future.
- Overly trusting technological, economic, and political solutions to meet the deepest needs of our souls.
- Underestimating how communication technologies can enhance our ability to share the gospel.
- Thinking only of the negative impacts of changes, rather than looking for opportunities to serve more people.
- Neglecting the sovereignty of God or the spiritual aspects of abundant life.
- Forgetting that God will provide wisdom as we humbly ask for it.

These are wonderful days for the gospel. We need strong leaders with godly character to make the most of these changes. Romans 12:9-10 is still true and will remain true for us: Love must be sincere. Hate what is evil; cling to what is good. Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves.

Yet among the mature we do impart **wisdom**, although it is not a **wisdom** of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are doomed to pass away.

Who is wise and understanding among you? By his good conduct let him show his works in the meekness of **wisdom**.

This is not the wisdom that comes down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, demonic.

But the **wisdom** from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, open to reason, full of mercy and good fruits, impartial and sincere.

207. <u>2 Peter 3:15</u>

And count the patience of our Lord as salvation, just as our beloved brother Paul also wrote to you according to the **wisdom** given him,
