Mingle Question: What's your favorite restaurant and why?

Restaurant Analogy: Menu-browser, Regular, Co-owner

Have you ever just checked out a restaurant's menu and then moved on? Sometimes you go ahead and put your name on the wait list, right? Maybe you find a restaurant that you go to every once in awhile, maybe on special occasions like your birthday or anniversary.

Then over time you start frequenting that restaurant a bit more. Maybe you even start telling friends and family about it. You find your favorite dish. You check out their specials. You begin to know the staff. You write a Google Review. You share posts on Facebook. Maybe you even become a Top Fan on Facebook.

Eventually you're a full-blown "regular". You're on a first name basis with the ownership. You've met the owners kids. They just head straight into the kitchen. Eventually, you're invited back into the kitchen too! They start getting your feedback on the menu and the overall experience. In fact, you get a job at this restaurant, not necessarily because you need the money as much as you love the restaurant and love the joy the food brings to people far and wide. Eventually, you're invited to buy in to the restaurant so now you have actual co-ownership in the place...and you couldn't be more proud of what you offer the community.

You look out the window and you see someone browsing the menu and you think, "I remember the first time I browsed the menu. I better go talk to that lady so she doesn't miss out on this amazing place!"

In many ways, Acts is about the people of the world browsing the menu and eventually owning the place.

- How do you move people from casual glances at the menu to taking ownership of the place?
- What makes for a place that you would even want to eat at, let alone have ownership in?

Acts covers 30 years over 28 chapters from 30-60 AD or so. That's a year and just under a month per chapter. That's 1960 years ago when Paul is under house arrest in Acts 28. If we were to still have church history written at the same rate that the chapters in Acts covered, about 1.07 years per chapter that would put us at Acts chapter 1839 in eight years, when our church plant hits the 10-year mark, if my calculations are correct.

Acts 1839:42-47 Contextualized/Paraphrased to Tallgrass Church

⁴²We devoted ourselves to the Scriptures and to our church family, to eating meals together including the Lord's Supper and to praying with and for one another diligently. ⁴³We prayed for God to do amazing things in our own hearts and in the neighborhoods we were in. And guess what, He did! Every single person who was a part of the Tallgrass family was amazed by what God was doing.

⁴⁴Many awesome things happened through every one of the followers of Jesus who called Tallgrass Church home. We were in it together; through joys and sorrows, anxiety and depression, life and death, sickness and health, great times and difficult times. We met one another's needs. ⁴⁵We were meeting together in some way, whether at Central Gathering, at LIFE Group, one-on-one discipleship, serving alongside one another in the community, or just going for a run or hunting or doing yoga together, just about every day of the week.

⁴⁶We ate together all the time with happy and generous hearts. We knew how to give to and receive from one another in a way that built up our community with the love of Jesus. We worshiped God through singing together and then through living out the Gospel throughout each week. ⁴⁷We had great rapport with all of Manhattan, KS and the surrounding communities. People were curious about our community. And Jesus added to the Tallgrass family every day, men and women and boys and girls of all sorts of backgrounds, to those who were in relationship with Him and who called Tallgrass their church family.

The Ache

What do you ache for in life? What's the ache for our folks connected to this?

- Abundant life? Longing for more meaning? Less depression, anxiety, and exhaustion?
- Serving others?
- Why would people want to move from menu-browsing to becoming a regular at our church? Why would people want to move from being a regular to becoming a cook or waiting tables? Why would someone want to move from working here to really taking ownership of the mission and vision of our church?

Back then and there to here and now!

- Mission Statement: Because God first loved us, we exist to love God and love our neighbors.
- God loves us. Therefore, love God. Love others.

Maturity for All

⁴¹So those who received his word were baptized, and there were added that day about three thousand souls.

⁴²And **THEY** (*ALL 3120ish people*) devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. ⁴³And awe came upon **EVERY** soul, and many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles. ⁴⁴And **ALL** who believed were together and had all things in common. ⁴⁵And **THEY** (*ALL 3120ish people*) were selling their possessions and belongings and distributing the proceeds to **ALL**, as **ANY** had need. ⁴⁶And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, **THEY** (*ALL 3120ish people*) received their food with glad and generous hearts, ⁴⁷praising God and having favor with **ALL** the people. The Great Commission

 - This is for ALL NATIONS of the earth!
- **Colossians 1:28-29** ²⁸Him we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone with all wisdom, that we may present everyone mature in Christ. ²⁹For this I toil, struggling with all his energy that he powerfully works within me.
 - This is for EVERY INDIVIDUAL in ALL NATIONS of the earth!
- We need help crafting a Vision Statement sometime.
- Our vision, what we want to accomplish, has to be related to the maturity of all who step through the doors into our church family.
 - Moving people from the fringe into the family to become (mature) followers of Jesus!
 - Concentric circles--core, committed, congregation, community, city, county country, continent, cosmos

Restaurant Analogy

- Devoted to L.I.F.E. How do we get there together? This is what Tallgrass Church is about!
- The abundant life starts with new life in Christ, not when we die!
- Three broad categories with mini-steps in between each:
 - Menu-browser
 - Regular
 - Co-owner
- Strategy: Create environments where participants are encouraged and equipped to engage with increasing devotion to L.I.F.E.!
- The local church is where we grow to maturity through living out the just about 60 “one anothers” in the New Testament.
- ***The “One Anothers” resource***
- Neighboring within our church family often can lead to others checking out our church.
 - Paxton and Judy LeMoine’s recent drywall party—Dilan Oglesby brought a friend. This was his friend’s first entry point to our church family...serving together!
 - The Tallgrass Church Moving Crew—Mike and Lacey Dunn’s recent move
 - The Tallgrass Church AutoCare Ministry

Menu-browsers: Where we expect GUESTS

- Website
- First-time visit
- On the fringe
- There are some events that function in this way, men’s get togethers like ManCamp (where we didn’t camp) last semester and ladies’ get togethers like the recent Galentine’s Dinner.
- But we’re primarily leaning on you all to be people’s initial exposure to our church family in your neighborhoods.
- We may need to create more environments for people to just checkout our community but we are leaning heavily on the Tallgrass family being ambassadors for our church.
- If you ever find the perfect church don’t join it because you’ll mess it up!
- One of the most beautiful things about a healthy church is when Jesus is the uniting factor, not age or race or worship preferences, etc. But Jesus and HIS GOSPEL and HIS KINGDOM!

Great couple questions to ask your neighbors:

- What brings you to Manhattan (or Wamego)?
- Do you have a faith community you're involved in?
- Let me know if I can help your transition into our community in any way.

Regulars: People start to connect as friends

- Central Gathering
- Start coming around a LIFE Group
- Start telling friends and family about your new church.
- Maybe you put a sticker on your water bottle and/or your car.

Great couple questions to ask folks beginning to come around:

- How can I help you get connected with our community?
- The first lunch or coffee with Ben or Dave is on Tallgrass Church! Ask them questions, get to know them and our church. And if you're a woman, you can meet with them together or they'll connect you with a woman in the church to get together with.

Co-owners: Life for our family happens in the kitchen

- this is our ultimate small group environment
- that is where life happens
- in the foyer you feel like a guest
- in the living room you start to make connections
- in the kitchen community with insiders happens
- We want everyone at the kitchen table
- You're invited to the company Christmas party.
- You get the end-of-year review.
- You help shape the menu and craft the environment of the space.
- We want to help everyone move towards becoming co-owners.
- The cool thing is, we can develop more restaurants as we grow. This is called church planting. Starts small, with one-on-one discipleship. Then gets a little bigger with LIFE Group multiplication. Eventually, we want to grow a good thing, and then offer it to more people out there who are starving for so many things, meaningful relationships with people and with God, engagement with the Scriptures (which is an acquired taste).

- What are some hindrances to you taking the next step of leadership?
- How would you like to serve in our community?

Neighboring Fund

- 2.5% goes to our Neighboring Fund—Currently has \$3300!
- Adoption Fund has about \$13,000!
- Ricky says, "Our Neighboring Fund is growing which means you ain't using it!"
 - We generally approve a minimum of \$50 per neighboring need and then utilize our means of communication to rally others around the need.
- We're not looking to focus all of our church efforts on one specific organization's missions in our community at this time. Rather, we want to come alongside ONE ANOTHER as we are involved in our neighbor's lives or as we have organizations we're passionate about.

Notes:

Andy Stanley, *From Foyer to Kitchen*

- We believe the local church should be irresistible—children and parents should wake up on Sunday morning and say, “We want to go to church.”
- We believe people who are NOT believers YET should be able to attend on Sunday morning, and want to go back the next week and check it out
 - in the Gospels, Jesus was irresistible
 - he wasn't someone you could ignore or marginalize
 - the Church is the Body of Christ
 - our local church and yours should reflect that same thing in society
- Story of explaining in Atlanta, GA—we need more relevant environments where believers and non-believers can connect to each other and connect to our heavenly Father
- This drove us to start [Northpoint Community Church](#)
 - started with 6 staff
 - hammered out mission statement: “Lead people into a growing relationship with Jesus Christ”
 - that was our version of saying the “Great Commission”
 - 3 components or pursuits:
 - 1 pursue intimacy with God
 - 2 community with insiders / believers
 - 3 influence with others outside the faith
- Generally discipleship or spiritual growth has been relegated to a series of classes— it meant “how much Bible do you know” (verses)

- Our goal for people wasn't an amount of knowledge or number of classes you'd attended, but the degree to which people are engaged in these 3 pursuits
- Our strategy recognized we can't MAKE someone do any of these things
- All of us in the group who valued these three pursuits realized we developed those passions and routines was ENVIRONMENT—relevant environment
- We decided if we created those environments, trained people to lead in those environments, and ...
- Mission: Lead People
Strategy: Creating environments where participants are encouraged and equipped to [engage in those 3 pursuits]
- We named the 3 environments for rooms in the house:
 - 1- Foyer
 - 2- Living Room
 - 3- Kitchen
- These environments do three different things
- Foyer environment: Where we expect GUESTS
- When guests are in your home, things are different: There are things you DO talk about, and things you don't
 - you change who you are as a family or what you believe, but you tailor the environment for the guest so they feel welcome and want to come back
 - we decided we needed to create some safe "foyer" environments to help guests feel welcome
- Living Room environment: people start to connect as friends
 - middle circle (we found) is the most difficult/challenging
 - everyone talks about getting people into small groups
 - we have constantly updated the transition part in the living room
- Kitchen environment: Life for our family happens in the kitchen
 - this is our ultimate small group environment
 - that is where life happens
 - in the foyer you feel like a guest
 - in the living room you start to make connections
 - in the kitchen community with insiders happens
- We want everyone at the kitchen table
- For adults we have 3 kinds of small groups: (that's the only one that meets on Sunday mornings at our church)
 - 1- starting point small groups: open group
 - 2- starter groups: we call it "dating" – it lasts 6 weeks, gives people a taste of group life, if they want to move on together they can – targeted group
 - 3- community groups: meet for 12 to 18 months, then they reform (they are closed groups)
- We've discovered community doesn't happen in an unpredictable environment—life on life doesn't happen in an environment where trust is uncertain
- Every small group comes to an end: either a happy end or a small end
 - people may go forward and multiple
 - people may decide they never want to be in another group
- Life happens within the church when we are focused together
- Our focus to evaluate all new PROGRAMS: Does this help us move people from the foyer, to the living room, to the kitchen?
 - we try to "add steps, not programs"
 - need to fill in gaps, help people move toward growth...
- "Your church strategy is perfectly designed to get the results you're getting"—so if you want to see change, to become an irresistible church, then discover what your strategy is and change it so you can talk about it intelligently so people understand what you are doing and how you do it
- Question: Are your ENVIRONMENTS accomplishing the mission?
- 3 takeaways:

- Would you go home and spend time clarifying your purpose / mission? What is the WIN we are wanting to celebrate?
- Would you go home and think through what it would take to develop a strategy? Can you put it in terms you can explain to your people? (This creates amazing synergy)
- Focus your environments—“Everybody wants to give their time and energy to something they understand” (you need to clarify your strategy w different terms)

- **Luke 1:35** And the angel answered her, "The **Holy Spirit** will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called **holy**—the Son of God.
- **Luke 1:41** And when Elizabeth heard the greeting of Mary, the baby leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the **Holy Spirit**,
- **Luke 1:67** [*Zechariah's Prophecy*] And his father Zechariah was filled with the **Holy Spirit** and prophesied, saying,
- **Luke 2:25** Now there was a man in Jerusalem, whose name was Simeon, and this man was righteous and devout, waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the **Holy Spirit** was upon him.
- **Luke 2:26** And it had been revealed to him by the **Holy Spirit** that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ.
- **Luke 3:16** John answered them all, saying, "I baptize you with water, but he who is mightier than I is coming, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptize you with the **Holy Spirit** and fire.
- **Luke 3:22** and the **Holy Spirit** descended on him in bodily form, like a dove; and a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."
- **Luke 4:1** [*The Temptation of Jesus*] And Jesus, full of the **Holy Spirit**, returned from the Jordan and was led by the **Spirit** in the wilderness
- **Luke 10:21** [*Jesus Rejoices in the Father's Will*] In that same hour he rejoiced in the **Holy Spirit** and said, "I thank you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, that you have hidden these things from the wise and understanding and revealed them to little children; yes, Father, for such was your gracious will.
- **Luke 11:13** If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the **Holy Spirit** to those who ask him!"
- **Luke 12:10** And everyone who speaks a word against the Son of Man will be forgiven, but the one who blasphemes against the **Holy Spirit** will not be forgiven.
- **Luke 12:12** for the **Holy Spirit** will teach you in that very hour what you ought to say."
- **Acts 1:1** [*The Promise of the Holy Spirit*] In the first book, O Theophilus, I have dealt with all that Jesus began to do and teach,
- **Acts 1:2** until the day when he was taken up, after he had given commands through the **Holy Spirit** to the apostles whom he had chosen.

- **Acts 1:5** for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the **Holy Spirit** not many days from now.”
- **Acts 1:8** But you will receive power when the **Holy Spirit** has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.”
- **Acts 1:16** “Brothers, the Scripture had to be fulfilled, which the **Holy Spirit** spoke beforehand by the mouth of David concerning Judas, who became a guide to those who arrested Jesus.
- **Acts 2:1** [*The Coming of the Holy Spirit*] When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place.
- **Acts 2:4** And they were all filled with the **Holy Spirit** and began to speak in other tongues as the **Spirit** gave them utterance.
- **Acts 2:33** Being therefore exalted at the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the **Holy Spirit**, he has poured out this that you yourselves are seeing and hearing.
- **Acts 2:38** And Peter said to them, “Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the **Holy Spirit**.
- **Acts 4:8** Then Peter, filled with the **Holy Spirit**, said to them, “Rulers of the people and elders,
- **Acts 4:25** who through the mouth of our father David, your servant, said by the **Holy Spirit**, ““Why did the Gentiles rage, and the peoples plot in vain?
- **Acts 4:31** And when they had prayed, the place in which they were gathered together was shaken, and they were all filled with the **Holy Spirit** and continued to speak the word of God with boldness.
- **Acts 5:3** But Peter said, “Ananias, why has Satan filled your heart to lie to the **Holy Spirit** and to keep back for yourself part of the proceeds of the land?
- **Acts 5:32** And we are witnesses to these things, and so is the **Holy Spirit**, whom God has given to those who obey him.”
- **Acts 6:5** And what they said pleased the whole gathering, and they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and of the **Holy Spirit**, and Philip, and Prochorus, and Nicanor, and Timon, and Parmenas, and Nicolaus, a proselyte of Antioch.
- **Acts 7:51** “You stiff-necked people, uncircumcised in heart and ears, you always resist the **Holy Spirit**. As your fathers did, so do you.
- **Acts 7:55** But he, full of the **Holy Spirit**, gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God.
- **Acts 8:15** who came down and prayed for them that they might receive the **Holy Spirit**,
- **Acts 8:17** Then they laid their hands on them and they received the **Holy Spirit**.
- **Acts 8:19** saying, “Give me this power also, so that anyone on whom I lay my hands may receive the **Holy Spirit**.”
- **Acts 9:17** So Ananias departed and entered the house. And laying his hands on him he said, “Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus who appeared to you on the road by which you came has sent me so that you may regain your sight and be filled with the **Holy Spirit**.”
- **Acts 9:31** So the church throughout all Judea and Galilee and Samaria had peace and was being built up. And walking in the fear of the Lord and in the comfort of the **Holy Spirit**, it multiplied.
- **Acts 10:38** how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the **Holy Spirit** and with power. He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him.
- **Acts 10:44** [*The Holy Spirit Falls on the Gentiles*] While Peter was still saying these things, the **Holy Spirit** fell on all who heard the word.
- **Acts 10:45** And the believers from among the circumcised who had come with Peter were amazed, because the gift of the **Holy Spirit** was poured out even on the Gentiles.
- **Acts 10:47** “Can anyone withhold water for baptizing these people, who have received the **Holy Spirit** just as we have?”
- **Acts 11:15** As I began to speak, the **Holy Spirit** fell on them just as on us at the beginning.
- **Acts 11:16** And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he said, ‘John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the **Holy Spirit**.’

- **Acts 11:24** for he was a good man, full of the **Holy Spirit** and of faith. And a great many people were added to the Lord.
- **Acts 13:2** While they were worshipping the Lord and fasting, the **Holy Spirit** said, "Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them."
- **Acts 13:4** [*Barnabas and Saul on Cyprus*] So, being sent out by the **Holy Spirit**, they went down to Seleucia, and from there they sailed to Cyprus.
- **Acts 13:9** But Saul, who was also called Paul, filled with the **Holy Spirit**, looked intently at him
- **Acts 13:52** And the disciples were filled with joy and with the **Holy Spirit**.
- **Acts 15:8** And God, who knows the heart, bore witness to them, by giving them the **Holy Spirit** just as he did to us,
- **Acts 15:28** For it has seemed good to the **Holy Spirit** and to us to lay on you no greater burden than these requirements:
- **Acts 16:6** [*The Macedonian Call*] And they went through the region of Phrygia and Galatia, having been forbidden by the **Holy Spirit** to speak the word in Asia.
- **Acts 19:2** And he said to them, "Did you receive the **Holy Spirit** when you believed?" And they said, "No, we have not even heard that there is a **Holy Spirit**."
- **Acts 19:6** And when Paul had laid his hands on them, the **Holy Spirit** came on them, and they began speaking in tongues and prophesying.
- **Acts 20:23** except that the **Holy Spirit** testifies to me in every city that imprisonment and afflictions await me.
- **Acts 20:28** Pay careful attention to yourselves and to all the flock, in which the **Holy Spirit** has made you overseers, to care for the church of God, which he obtained with his own blood.
- **Acts 21:11** And coming to us, he took Paul's belt and bound his own feet and hands and said, "Thus says the **Holy Spirit**, 'This is how the Jews at Jerusalem will bind the man who owns this belt and deliver him into the hands of the Gentiles.'"
- **Acts 28:25** And disagreeing among themselves, they departed after Paul had made one statement: "The **Holy Spirit** was right in saying to your fathers through Isaiah the prophet:
