Child Care

Child Care Aware is available to help locate licensed child care options at www.ks.childcareaware.org or via phone at 877-678-2548.

The Kansas State Department of Education advises that families who need flexible options or irregular care might consider having someone come into the home. A known adult currently not working due to business closures might be available to help. They also advise that a license from KDHE is not required for 2 children or less to go into the home of another adult for 20 hours per week or less.
